

## Charging Indicator for E-Cigarettes Models

RN4081/510/KR808D-1/KR808D-2

Depending on the chip version in the battery and the version of charger, you can tell if the battery is fully charged by the charger led going from red to green or the led on the end of the battery going from bright to almost out or you may see both the battery led dim and the charger led green. Most of the newer chargers only have a green led showing the charger is plugged into a powered USB port. If you have the USB charger plugged into a computer USB port it will take a little longer than if you have it plugged into a USB wall adapter. A general rule of thumb is 2-3 hours for a standard battery (180mAh) and 3-4 for a mega battery (280mAh). We always suggest that you place any battery on a nonflammable surface while it is charging. I hope this has answered questions about the different charger/battery combinations. As the technology of the e-cigarette advances other changes will no doubt happen.
